The CARA Board of Directors and staff would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas. May you celebrate the true meaning of Christmas during the holidays and all that is beautiful, meaningful and brings you joy be yours throughout the coming year!

2024 was a year of many accomplishments for CARA. It marked 45 years of evaluating and demonstrating agricultural technologies as well as the sharing of relevant information with producers and others within the agricultural community. Our adaptive research program included approximately 2000 plots within 46 trials evaluating varieties, fertility and soil amendment treatments and other agronomics of both annual and perennial crops. These trials were all located on farmer's land at several points within the Special Areas and MD of Acadia.

CARA staff presented, hosted and partnered on the delivery of a broad range of information to over 4000 producers, industry representative and students during the year. Seminar and workshop topics included soil health, crop nutrition, grazing, shelterbelts, cattle production, kochia, ultra-sounding fed steers, market outlooks, safety, genetics and more. Analysis of feed, seed, water and soil samples was facilitated for producers and assistance with Environmental Farm Plans, producer funding programs and ration balancing was also provided.

Renovations and calibration of new equipment continued within the CARA Soil Health Lab during 2024, while analysis was performed on more than 3000 samples. Dr. Yamily Zavala trained 2 grad students in various lab procedures during March through May and also hosted a producer workshop and a tour for the Canola Council of Canada agronomists.

CARA's program would not be accomplished without tremendous local support. Sincere appreciation to the farmers and ranchers who serve on the Board of Directors and/or host project sites. Many thanks as well to the Special Areas Board and MD of Acadia for their continued financial support as well as our ag service boards, ag societies and agribusinesses for their assistance. The collaborative efforts of many enable us to support our local agricultural industry.

Connecting with Producers a Success at Western Canada Conference on Soil Health and Grazing

From December 10-12, ten Applied Research Associations and Forage Associations from across Alberta brought together over 500 producers, professionals, consultants and soil-health crusaders to the biannual Western Canada Conference on Soil Health and Grazing (WCCSHG) hosted at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel in Edmonton.

CARA was again an integral part of the WCCSHG organization team as Dianne, Rae and Karin oversaw registration from the time tickets went on sale in mid June until Tuesday morning in Edmonton when attendees started to arrive. Dr. Yamily Zavala was apart of the Conference Proceedings and Program Committees. The three day agenda featured researchers from various Canadian and American colleges and universities including Dr. Bart Lardner (U of S), Emma McGeough (U of M), Lana Shaw (South East Research Farm) sharing their findings, industry representatives who support Canadian farmers and ranchers such as the Canadian Roundtable for Sustainable Beef, and producers who shared their success and failures in implementing

Producer Panel was Special Area's own Craig Ference, Double F Farms, from Kirriemuir. On top of the extensive agenda there was a tradeshow made up of over thirty companies that provide soil amendment products, livestock marketing, electric fencing supplies, grazing consultants, riparian health specialists, farm management consultants and various seed companies. The CARA Soil Health Lab was included in the tradeshow and was overseen by the CARASHL Manager, Yamily, and Lab Technician, Navneet Kaur. Yamily even brought nematodes! Attendees also learned about the importance of aggregation stability through a simple demonstration that shows the range of stability soils can have depending on geographic location and the practices that influence soil health below ground. The WCCSHG tradeshow was a great opportunity for the CARASHL to promote their services and network with those interested in submitting samples or learning more about soil health in general.




